The Centre for Translation Studies (CTS) at University of Surrey is inviting expressions of interest for funded PhD studentships. Interested candidates will work together with members of CTS to prepare applications for a TECHNE studentship. The topic of the PhD will have to be related to the current research interests in CTS and be within the Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC) remit. Many topics related to terminology and lexicography would fit both requirements.

The Techne studentships cover both UK and international fees, and they also include a stipend. This call for applications is for PhD projects starting in Oct 2023 and it is open to students who have completed their masters degree and those who will complete their degree this academic year (subject to successful completion). Note you cannot apply directly for a studentship. The application needs to be done together with a potential supervisor from the University of Surrey and submitted via the portal.
